Voices of SummerFrom hills to vines, singing the landscapes

From the Adelaide Hills to the vineyards of McLaren Vale, 2018 opened with a summer of glorious singing and music making that enabled audiences to enjoy the gift and sounds of music amongst some of Adelaide's most beautiful landscapes.

A unique opportunity to experience Rodgers & Hammerstein's wonderful *Oklahoma*, as you have never done before, was provided by Emma Knights Productions, at Four Oaks Farm, Littlehampton, at the beginning of January.

Literally set on a farm, with cows lowing and with the opening lines sung by Curly riding in on a horse, this magical production featured an extraordinary cast of young professionals that could have easily graced the London West End stage. Both Charlie Smith as Curly and Rebecca Raymond as Laurey were outstanding as was State Opera's well known and loved Andrew Turner as Ali Hakim.



The energy of the whole cast and band, the beauty and magic of the music, and the setting made this an unforgettable experience and one not to be missed in the future. As a dear friend and colleague observed 'Once you have seen *Oklahoma* on a farm you'll never want to see it in a theatre again!'



Catriona Barr, Coriole Opera in the Vines

Renowned for its dedication to the arts, **Coriole** held the first **Opera in the Vines** on 13th January. Mark Lloyd, well known Coriole owner and arts lover, welcomed the audience to a program instigated and organised by State Opera Soloist, mezzo-soprano Catriona Barr. In the beautiful setting of Coriole's courtyard, on an unexpectedly chilly evening, the audience nevertheless enjoyed a wonderful concert from singers Desiree Frahn (soprano), Joshua Rowe (baritone) and Catriona Barr (mezzo-soprano), accompanied by Michael Ierace (keyboard) and Ashleigh Geiger (cello).

The first half consisted of arias by Monteverdi, Mozart and Handel while the second, following a picnic break, featured a broader range. From Offenbach's beautiful *Barcarolle* and Puccini's *O Mio babbino caro* sung by Desiree, Gremin's aria from *Eugene Onegin* by Tchaikovsky sung by Joshua, and the *Habanera* from *Carmen* sung by Catriona, the program moved on to the lighter, lyrical music of Rodgers & Hammerstein, Arlen & Harburg (*Somewhere over the Rainbow*), a spicy '*Tennis Duet*' from City of Angels by Coleman & Gelbart from Catriona and Joshua, to a finale of Gershwin's *Summertime* arranged beautifully as a trio.

Congratulations and thanks to all involved for this original and sparkling night and it is hoped there will be another 'vintage' of **Opera in the Vines** next year!

'Let us make the most brilliant music' was the title of a unique and innovative recital created by Various People Inc and presented in the Great Hall at Carrick Hill as part of this year's French Festival on 14th January.

Well known for their creative and innovative work (their most recent production was *Orpheus Underground*, a retelling of the Orpheus myth in the tunnels beneath the old Treasury Building in central Adelaide), Various People Artistic Director, Cheryl Pickering wove together the music from a succession of legendary composers appointed to Le Roi Francais. The brilliance of Louis XIV court was enhanced by composers, from François Couperin, Marc-Antoine Charpentier, and Jean-Phillipe Rameau to Louis-Claude Daquin, Jean-François Dandrieu and André Campra, to name a few, all highly influential in the development of the grand French baroque style. The program's vocal works, sung superbly by the beautifully gowned sopranos Kate Louise Macfarlane and Bethany Hill were interspersed with pieces from the French Harpsichord school, played by renowned harpsichordist, Anne Whelan. As well as singing the highly challenging arias, both Kate and Bethany held the audience spell bound with their fascinating and delightful recounting of a 'day in the life 'of the Sun King.



From the regal setting of the Great Hall in Carrick Hill, to the innovative and original program with the singing and playing of these talented artists, they did indeed '*make the most brilliant music'*.

Yarmila has a long history in the Arts, as CEO of the Sydney Youth Orchestras and Head of Classical Music at the Sydney Opera House. Yarmila said, 'I am positively overwhelmed with excitement by this wonderful opportunity to join State Opera SA; a company whose work has a proud history and one which arts aficionados regularly reference in discussions about opera, invention and achievement in the performing arts. This company has a great legacy upon which we can build an exciting future'.



Stuart has been directing operas and musicals for the last thirty years including here at State Opera SA. Opera Australia and New Zealand Opera. His significant achievements in the field of opera were recognised in 2012 when he was made a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) Stuart commented. 'This is a great challenge for me – joining a company embarking on a new chapter, whose boldness in programming I have long admired and in a city I have always loved. I look forward immensely to working with the SOSA team to scale new artistic heights and develop audiences across the state. Opera in Australia needs a vibrant, forward thinking company to celebrate the unique possibilities on offer, and SOSA is just that company'.

Beau applied for a grant from The Friends to receive intensive training from Liane Keegan in Melbourne last year. Taken from his report, Beau said "...we began working and can I say that over the next few weeks, singing has never felt like so much work. It was incredible. I'll be doing my best to implement as much of what I learned as possible so that I can be on my way to developing a proper formed and consistent technique". Karina has been accepted into the International Lyric Academy in Vincenza, Italy, in July where she will be performing Pamina in *The Magic Flute* in a fully staged production with orchestra.
